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IT IDIQ Contract Overview

IDIQ Procurement for IT Services:

IT consulting and technical support services are procured through a streamlined, competitive and cost-effective procurement process utilizing the Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) Master Contract.

Contract Highlights:

- In April 2018, **98 Master Vendors** were approved for providing services under the IDIQ Master Contract for Five (5) Years from <u>July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2023</u> under specific Functional Areas and Labor Categories.
- Out of the 98 Master Vendors approved, 36 vendors were awarded Task Orders in the FY 2020.
- Task Orders are awarded for a **Base Period** of **Three (3) Years**, with **Two (2)**, **One (1) year** optional extensions.







Request for Approval

The MHBE requests the Board to approve a total Not-to-exceed (NTE) amount of \$24,210,000, with Federal Financial Participation amount of \$17,421,450 and State Participation amount of \$6,788,550, for the IT Consulting and Technical Support Services IDIQ (Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity) contracts for the Fiscal Year 2021.



Akamai License Renewal

Background

MHBE utilizes Akamai product suite to protect its Web and Mobile platform, perform Security Optimization, implement Waiting Room, enhance Website Performance and Cloud Monitor functions for the secured and efficient operations of HBX (Health Benefit Exchange) systems.

Procurement Summary

- The Akamai licenses expire on June 30, 2020
- The License Renewal period (1 year) is from July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021
- MHBE spent \$456,507.24 to procure Akamai Licenses in FY 2020.
- The cost of Akamai license renewal is \$438,545.40
- An IFB (Invitation for Bids) was issued in April to seek competitive bids from resellers. The IFB closed on May 15, 2020 at 11:00 a.m. MHBE received three competitive bids.
- MHBE found Carahsoft Technology Corporation's bid of \$438,545.40 to be the lowest responsive bid. MHBE intends to issue the Award to Carahsoft Technology Corporation upon Board approval.
